PROJECT MISSION

Using wheelbarrows, pitch forks and rakes, we will spread bark mulch through out the Ropes Course. The town will provide wheelbarrows, pitch forks, rakes and gloves. The supply of pitch forks and rakes is limited, if you have a pitch fork or a stiff rake please bring them to supplement the tools provided. Wear clothing and shoes that are appropriate for working outdoors and if you have gloves that you use for yard work at home, you may want to bring them to wear for this project.

DIRECTIONS

From Interstate 40

Take I-40 (East or West) to Exit 280 - Davis Drive
Take Davis Drive south towards Cary/Apex.
Turn left onto High House Road.
Turn right into Fred G. Bond Metro Park

From Airport

Take Aviation Parkway south to Hwy 54.
Turn left onto Hwy 54.
Turn right onto Cary Parkway.
Turn left onto High House Road.
Turn right at Fred G. Bond Metro Park (about 0.5 miles from Cary Parkway)

From Raleigh

Take US-1 south to Cary Parkway.
Turn right onto Cary Parkway.
Turn right onto High House Road.
Turn right at Fred G. Bond Metro Park (about 0.5 miles from Cary Parkway)

There are two entrances to the park, if the first one is missed continue on High House and enter the second entrance. After turning into the park, travel 1/10 of a mile, turn right on Metro Park Drive and take Metro Park to its conclusion at the Ropes Shelter. You can also just follow the signs indicating *Challenge Course & Ropes Shelter*. Parking is immediately adjacent to the shelter.
